### NEW Flu Vaccination This Winter - It's not to be sniffed at!



Flu vaccination is available every year on the NHS to help protect adults and children at risk of flu and its complications. Flu can be unpleasant, but if you're otherwise healthy, it'll usually clear up on its own within a week.

But some people are more susceptible to the effects of flu. For them, it can increase the risk of developing more serious illnesses such as bronchitis and pneumonia, or can make

existing conditions worse. In the worst cases, flu can result in a stay in hospital, or even death.

#### Who should consider having the flu vaccine?

- Everyone aged 65 and over
- Everyone under 65 years of age who has a long term medical condition
- All pregnant women, at any stage of pregnancy
- Everyone living in a residential or nursing home
- Everyone who cares for an older or disabled person
- Household contacts of anyone who is immunocompromised
- All children who were aged 2 or 3 years old on 31 August 2019
- All children in primary school
- All frontline health and social care workers


It is best to have the flu vaccination in the autumn before any outbreaks of flu. For advice and information about the flu vaccination, speak to your GP, practice nurse or pharmacist.

Remember that you need it every year, so don't assume you are protected because you were vaccinated last year.

The doctors and staff at this practice get vaccinated each year to protect themselves and patients - and they recommend that all eligible patients do the same.

### Vitamin D



Most people living in the UK have low vitamin D levels in the autumn and winter. Your body creates vitamin D from direct sunlight on the skin when outdoors. But between October and

early March we don't get enough vitamin D from sunlight.

Vitamin D regulates the amount of calcium and phosphate in the body, both needed for healthy bones, teeth and muscles.

Public Health England recommends taking a daily supplement of 10 micrograms. For certain limited health conditions vitamin D is available on prescription but for most a suitable supplement can be purchased from supermarkets.

### **Emollients Can Help Dry, Itchy or Scaly Skin**

Lots of people develop dry, chapped skin in the winter which can be relieved by simple moisturisers. Emollients or moisturising creams such as **Zerobase**, **Diprobase** and **Cetraben** are available on prescription for patients with skin conditions such as widespread eczema or psoriasis.

GPs are advised against prescribing these treatments for simple dry skin so please self purchase or ask the pharmacist what is available over the counter. If the skin condition is more severe, talk to a GP, nurse or health visitor, as you may need a stronger treatment.


### **Practice Boundaries**

At the surgery, the last day to order a prescription in time for Christmas is by 11 am on:

Prescriptions ordered after this date will not be ready for collection until Monday 30th.

Please remember we cannot take prescription orders by phone at the surgery.

### **GP+ Nottingham City Extended Hours Access For Patients**



All patients registered at practices in Nottingham city can access additional routine appointments at evenings and weekends through our **GP+ Nottingham City** service.

The service offers appointments with GPs, practice nurses, clinical pharmacists, physiotherapists and stop smoking

advisors in a fully equipped accessible location in the heart of Nottingham city.

To book an appointment, simply need to contact reception team at your GP practice.

### This is not a walk-in service and all appointments must be pre-booked.

The GP+ Service has been funded by NHS Nottingham City Clinical Commissioning Group and is being operated by the Nottingham City GP Alliance (NCGPA).

The Care Quality Commission, who are the independent regulator of health and social care providers in England, carried out their first periodic inspection of the GP+ service in February 2019 awarded the service a "Good" rating.

### **Clinical Commissioning Group Update**



The new integrated system for the joint delivery of health and social care is evolving across Nottingham and Nottinghamshire.

A key part of this involves setting up Primary Care Networks (PCNs) which will become the main vehicle for delivering

neighbourhood services in health and social care. This will involve teams of GPs, pharmacists, housing support officers, mental health practitioners, occupational/physio therapists working together to deliver "joined up" services at a local level.

The new patient engagement forum representing the four Greater Nottingham clinical commissioning groups (PPEC - Public and Patient Engagement Committee) has met twice since the summer and is actively involved, together with <a href="Healthwatch">Healthwatch</a> in the discussions taking place to ensure that our local health delivery plan for the next five years is aligned with the expectations of our population.

There will be formal launch activities for the system plan when it is published in November.

Victoria and Mapperley practice is actively involved in this exciting development and our PPG will continue to act as the patient voice representing our practice.

No appointment is needed; just drop in between 7am and 9pm - 365 days a year.
